I just finished this book about Mount Everest. It was a cliffhanger.



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FUN FACTS about BOOKS AND AUTHORS

The most expensive book ever purchased was sold for \$30.8 million.

It was *Codex Leicester* by Leonardo Da Vinci, and was purchased by Bill Gates.

On his marriage document in 1582, William Shakespeare's name was spelled 'William Shagspeare'.

When staying in hotels, Hans Christian Andersen always carried a coil of rope with him in case he needed to escape from a fire.

The record for most people balancing books on their heads at the same place and time is 998 in Sydney, Australia, in 2012.


Jack Kerouac typed up his novel *On the Road* on one continuous roll of paper that was 120 feet long.

Dr Seuss' first book was rejected by over 20 publishers; his books have now sold over 500 million copies worldwide.

T. S. Eliot was a huge fan of Groucho Marx; he wrote the comedian a fan letter and kept a picture of him on his wall.

Reading for just six minutes a day can reduce stress by 68%.

Joseph Conrad, author of *Heart of Darkness*, avoided reading reviews of his work and instead measured them with a ruler. The longer the review, the better he felt about it.

On days when he gave public readings from his novels, Charles Dickens had two tablespoons of rum with fresh cream for breakfast, and a pint of champagne for tea.

The smallest book in the Welsh National Library is *Old King Cole*. It measures 1mm x 1mm and the pages can only be turned with a needle.
