FRENCH TRIVLA

The French call the French Riviera Côte d'Azur.

French was the official language of England for over 300 years (1066 until the 1400s). Currently French is the official language of 30 countries worldwide.

More than 10 million people in North America speak French.

French people enjoy eating snails, frog legs and horsemeat.

The croissant was invented in Austria.

French men have the lowest level of obesity in Europe and women are second after Denmark.

France is the most visited country in the world, with 80 million tourists annually. It is one country where the number of annual tourists exceeds the population (66 million people).

During the French Revolution the metric system was invented by French cleric Gabriel Mouton.

Wearing a white wedding dress is a French tradition which began in 1499.

André Gide, French Nobel Prize in Literature, said: "French people are Italian people in a bad mood"!

The world's first true department store was 'Le Bon Marché' in Paris, founded in 1838.

There are 40,000 châteaux (castles, palaces and manors) in France.

The largest and most advanced passenger cruise ship, the Queen Mary II, was built in France in 2004.

The most visited place in France is not the Eiffel Tower (7 million) or the Louvre Museum (9 million); it is Disneyland Paris; it had 13 million visitors in 2016!

The French Army was the first to use camouflage in 1915 (World War I).

Famous French inventions include: the hot air balloon, the submarine, the parachute, photography, the ambulance service, animation and cinema, hair drier, and the stethoscope.

The name 'France' comes from the Franks, a Germanic tribe from the 2nd century.

The Gallic rooster (French: le coq gaulois) is the unofficial national symbol of France.

France is the largest European country in terms of land area after Russia and Ukraine.

The Verdon Gorge is the second largest canyon in the world. It is situated where Provence meets the Alps. It is 25 kilometres in length and up to 700 meters deep.

French people greet each other (even men) with one, two or three kisses, depending on the region.

There are 300 kinds of cheeses made in France.

The most expensive weapon ever sold was a sabre belonging to Napoleon I. It sold at auction in 2007 for 4.8 million Euros.

'Foie gras' despite being thought of as 'French' food, dates back 4,500 years to Egypt, from where it spread to Greece and then the Romans brought it to Gaul, today known as France.

The French national anthem "La Marseillaise", was composed in Strasbourg in 1792, not in Marseilles.

The Frenchman, diplomat, and scholar Jean Nicot was 29 years old when in 1559 he was sent to Portugal as an Ambassador. On his return he brought with him some tobacco plants. The plant was instantly successful and Nicot became a celebrity. The word 'nicotine' was created in his honour.

Paris is over 2,000 years old.

'French Toast' isn't French at all. Despite having different origins it is said that American Chef Joseph French advertised the modern toast but forgot to add the apostrophe.

In 1800 an official law was passed in France that women could not wear trousers without a police permit. A century later exceptions were introduced for horse riding. After 213 years the law was abolished.

FLAMENCO: Flamenco consists of staccato dancing, castanets, hand clapping and passionate guitar picking.

BULLFIGHTING: Bullfighting is part of the Spanish culture. It is considered more of an art than a sport.

FAMOUS PEOPLE: Pablo Picasso, Salvador Dali, Rafael Nadal, Penelope Cruz, Hernando Cortes, Miguel de Cervantes







SPAINISH TRIVIA

- 1. The Kingdom of Spain, as it's officially known, is the second largest country in the EU. Spain covers around 85% of the Iberian Peninsula, which it shares with Portugal.
- 2. Spanish is the second most widely spoken language in the world after Chinese. There are an estimated 437 million people native speakers of Spanish.
- 3. There are four official languages in Spain (Castilian, Catalan, Basque and Galician), three unofficial regional languages (Asturian, Aragonese, and Aranese), and several more dialects.
- 4. The Spaniards have a completely different life rhythm from other Europeans. They typically have lunch between 1 and 3 pm, and dinner around 10 pm.
- 5. Madrid is in the physical center of the country and the plaza Puerta del Sol is the exact center of the country.
- 6. Spanish culture greatly influenced modern art from the late 1800s, with artists like Antoni Gaudí (Art Nouveau), Pablo Picasso (expressionism, cubism, surrealism), Joan Miró (surrealism), and Salvador Dalí (surrealism).
- 7. The first 'novel' is attributed to a Spaniard. Cervantes' Don Quixote, written in 1605, is considered to be the first modern novel.
- 8. Spain is renowned for its lively festivals, including San Fermín ('running of the bulls') in Pamplona and Tomatina ('tomato battle') in Buñol.
- 9. Spain produces around half of the world's olive oil.
- 10. 58 million tourists go to Spain every year, making it the fourth most visited country in the world.
- 11. Spain has the highest amount of bars in all of Europe.
- 12. Spain still has a king who is the head of state, but with little to none` power over the country's laws and regulations. The current King of Spain is Felipe VI.
- 13. The national anthem of Spain has no words.

- 14. The Bull is the national animal of Spain.
- 15. Flamenco is not actually a dance; it's a musical style, which sometimes has dancing in it.
- 16. There are no laws about public nudity in Spain.
- 17. The tooth fairy is a mere rodent in Spain, referred to as Ratoncito Pérez.


GREEK TRIVIA

- 1. Greece is roughly the size (in area) of England or the state of Alabama.
- 2. Greece is one of the sunniest countries in the world. The whole country has more than 250 days of sun on average!
- 3. There are more than 2000 islands. Only 170 of them are populated.
- 4. 40% of the total population of Greece is residing in the capital Athens.
- 5. Approximately 98% of the people in Greece are ethnic Greeks. Turks form the largest minority group.
- 6. Ikaria, a Greek island on the Aegean Sea, is one of the world's blue zones where people have the longest lifespans. People here live on average 10 years longer than those in the rest of Europe and America.
- 7. There are more tourists in Greece than Greeks during summer. It is one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world and receives more than 30 million visitors each year.
- 8. Greece has one of the richest varieties of wildlife in Europe.
- 9. In Greece, people celebrate the "name day" of the saint that bears their name rather than their own birthday.
- 10. Greek is the oldest written language still in existence.
- 11. Voting is required by law in Greece for every citizen who is 18 or older.
- 12. The saying "taking the bull by its horns" comes from the Greek myth of Hercules saving Crete from a raging bull by seizing its horns.
- 13. Football, or what Americans call soccer, is the national sport of Greece.
- 14. Feta, which is made from goat's milk, is the Greece's national cheese.

15. The city of Rhodes (the capital of the island of Rhodes) is the most popular location for tourists in Greece. The city is famous for housing one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World: the Colossus of Rhodes (from which the word "colossal" is derived). This gigantic 98-foot (303-metre) statue of the god Helios, whose legs straddled the harbor, was destroyed by an earthquake in 226 B.C.




