A little History on the Handbag

Who invented the handbag?

In 1841, Yorkshire entrepreneur Samuel Parkinson, whose Butterscotch confectionary was appointed to the British royal household, wanted to treat his wife to a custom-made set of hand luggage. He had noticed that her purse was too small and not made of a sturdy enough material for traveling.

When was the first handbag made?

The world's oldest purse was discovered in Germany in 2012. It was studded with dog teeth and dated from between 2,500 and 2,200 B.C. By 1300 however, fashion had clearly moved on. The world's oldest handbag is a 700-year-old-clutch discovered in the city of Mosul in Northern Iraq.

When did handbags become popular?

The conspicuous wealth and consumer culture of the 1980s produced large, flashy, highly decorated status bags. The handbag, in these times, served as a status symbol, with the richest women carrying the most expensive bags.

What is the difference between bag and purse?

In the UK, purse is also used for bigger bags that hold more stuff. And in America, both words are used to refer to the same kind of bag. A purse is used to describe a bag with straps that can be worn over the shoulder. ... While purse and handbags are remarkably similar, most people agree that handbags are roomier than purses.

Handbags

It was during the ancient Egyptian era where the first handbags were used. The evidence was recorded on 14th-century hieroglyphics. It was not uncommon for ancient Egyptian men to carry pouches (that resembled purses or handbags) which they would tie around their waists to carry tools and items in.

Do you know that Louis Vuitton burns all its unsold bags? This rumour appears to be true. If the bags are not sold, the company just burns them to prevent marking a lower price in them.

The developing technological advancements during the 17th century paved the way for the creation of bags made of various fabrics. The increase in train travel and the growing number of railroad constructions means that people needed a practical and spacious item that would carry and store their important belongings. And so, the handbag was invented!

It is said that an average woman has six handbags.

The first handbag with a zipper was introduced by Hermes in 1923. Before that, bags were typically closed by drawstrings, since they were a common accessory used to carry coins.

If given the chance to splurge, 22% of women said they would choose a handbag, while only 9% would spend on shoes.

In the days of rationing during the World War II era, Gucci started to use canes as bag handles because leather was scarce.

Nowadays though, this piece has become fashionable.



- 1. There are 27 bones, 29 joints and at least 123 named ligaments in the human hand.







"That's amazing!" says the man, "What was that?"


She passes him the can and he reads the label on the side - "Hair Restorer with Permanent Wave".




