DECEMBER 1

ON THIS DAY

- **1913** The Ford Motor Company introduces the continuously moving assembly line, producing a complete automobile every two-and-a-half minutes. It was the first true "mass production" system.
- **1953** Hugh Hefner publishes 1st edition of Playboy magazine, featuring Marilyn Monroe as the magazine's 1st centrefold.
- **1955** Rosa Parks is arrested for refusing to move to the back of a bus and give her seat to a white passenger in Montgomery, Alabama.
- **1958** #1 Hit: The Teddy Bears - *To Know Him Is to Love Him*
- **1973** #1 Hit: The Carpenters - *Top of the World*
- **1982** *Thriller*, 6th studio album by Michael Jackson is released (Grammy Award Album of the Year 1984)

Bette Midler

Singer & Actress

BORN December 1st, 1945
NATIONALITY American

Born in Hawaii in 1945, Bette Midler ("The Divine Miss M") first appeared on Broadway in *Fiddler on the Roof* (1966–69).

She made her motion picture debut in 1979 with *The Rose* which earned her a Golden Globe for Best Actress as well an Academy Award nomination. Her title song from the film also went on to win a Grammy. Midler went on to win a Grammy for *Wind Beneath My Wings* from the film *Beaches* (1988), and garnered a second Oscar nomination with *For the Boys* (1991).

She has since released several studio albums and starred in an array of film and stage productions, including the Broadway revival of *Hello, Dolly* for which she received the 2017 Tony Award for Best Actress in a Musical.

She has been married for over 35 years and has 1 daughter.

Gianni Versace

Fashion Designer

BORN December 2nd, 1946

DIED 1997 (aged 50)

NATIONALITY Italian

Born in Italy, Giovanni 'Gianni' Versace became one of the top fashion designers of the 1980s and '90s. His international fashion empire, Versace, produces accessories, fragrances, make-up, home furnishings, and clothes. He also designed costumes for theatre and films.

As a friend of Eric Clapton, Diana, Princess of Wales, Naomi Campbell, Duran Duran, Madonna, Elton John, Cher, Sting, and many other celebrities, he was one of the first designers to link fashion to the music world.

One of his most famous creations was a black dress held together at the sides by gold safety pins; worn by Elizabeth Hurley at a movie premiere in 1994; the dress helped make the actress a star.

Versace was murdered by firearm outside his Miami Beach mansion in 1997. He was 50 years old. He was never married and had no children.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY

DECEMBER 3

ON THIS DAY

- 1854** Eureka Stockade: In what is claimed by many to be the birth of Australian democracy, more than 20 goldminers in Ballarat, Victoria, are killed by state troopers in an uprising over mining licences.
- 1926** Detective novelist Agatha Christie mysteriously disappears for 11 days. She was found safe and well, but in circumstances so strange that they raised more questions than they solved. Christie herself was unable to provide any clues as to what had happened to her.
- 1947** *A Streetcar Named Desire* opens on Broadway. 23-year-old Marlon Brando played the rough, working-class Polish-American Stanley Kowalski. It was made into a movie 4 years later with Brando reprising his role.
- 1966** #1 Hit: The New Vaudeville Band - *Winchester Cathedral*
- 1976** An assassination attempt is made on Bob Marley. Shot twice, he quickly recovered.
- 1994** The Sony PlayStation is released in Japan.

Ozzy Osbourne

Vocalist & Songwriter

BORN December 3rd, 1948
NATIONALITY English

John Michael "Ozzy" Osbourne, also known as 'The Prince of Darkness' rose to prominence during the 1970s as the lead vocalist of the heavy metal band Black Sabbath.

He was fired from Black Sabbath in 1979 and went on to have a successful solo career, releasing 11 studio albums, the first seven of which were all awarded multi-platinum certifications in the US. Osbourne has since reunited with Black Sabbath on several occasions. His longevity and success have earned him the informal title of "Godfather of Heavy Metal".

In the early 2000s, Osbourne became a reality television star, appearing as himself in the MTV reality show *The Osbourne's*, alongside wife and manager Sharon and two of their three children, Kelly and Jack.

He has been married twice and has 6 children.

Jeff Bridges

Actor & Singer

BORN December 4th, 1949
NATIONALITY American

Jeff Bridges comes from a prominent acting family and appeared on the television series *Sea Hunt* (1958–60) with his father Lloyd Bridges and brother Beau Bridges.

His breakthrough role came with *The Last Picture Show* (1971), for which he earned his first Academy Award nomination. Following this, he received Oscar nominations for *Thunderbolt* and *Lightfoot* (1974) and *Starman* (1984).

Bridges went on to star in the popular films *Heaven's Gate* (1980), *TRON* (1982), *The Fisher King* (1991), with Robin Williams, *The Mirror Has Two Faces* (1996), alongside Barbra Streisand, and the cult hit *The Big Lebowski* (1998). Following decades of acclaimed work, he finally nabbed an Oscar for his performance in *Crazy Heart* (2009).

Bridges has been married for over 40 years and has 3 daughters.

ON THIS DAY

- **1933** Prohibition in the United States ends.
- **1945** Aircraft squadron is lost in the Bermuda Triangle. Five U.S. Navy Avenger torpedo-bombers took off from the Ft. Lauderdale Naval Air Station in Florida on a routine three-hour training mission. They never returned.
- **1974** Final episode of *Monty Python's Flying Circus* airs on BBC TV.
- **1987** #1 Hit: Belinda Carlisle - *Heaven Is a Place on Earth*
- **2006** Audrey Hepburn's Givenchy little black dress from film *Breakfast at Tiffany's* is auctioned for charity for a record £467,200.
- **2017** Russia is banned from the next Winter Olympics in South Korea over state-sponsored doping.

Walt Disney

Entrepreneur, Animator & Producer

BORN December 5th, 1901

DIED 1966 (aged 65)

NATIONALITY American

Walt Disney co-founded Walt Disney Productions with his brother Roy, which became one of the best-known motion-picture production companies in the world.

His first major success was the character Mickey Mouse, which he developed in 1928; he also provided the voice for his creation in the early years. He went on to create the feature films *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs* (1937), *Pinocchio* (1940), *Fantasia* (1940), *Dumbo* (1941), and *Bambi* (1942). New animated and live-action films followed after World War II, including the critically successful *Cinderella* (1950) and *Mary Poppins* (1964), which received five Academy Awards.

He won 22 Academy Awards during his lifetime, and was the founder of theme parks Disneyland and Walt Disney World. He was married once and had 2 children.

ON THIS DAY

- **1768** The 1st edition of *Encyclopedia Britannica* is published in Scotland.
- **1784** Transportation of convicts from England to Australia is first authorised.
- **1865** 13th Amendment of the United States Constitution is ratified, abolishing slavery.
- **1877** Thomas Edison records himself reciting "Mary had a little lamb".
- **1917** Finnish Declaration of Independence. The declaration ended 109 years of Finland being a Grand Duchy in the Russian Empire.
- **1933** A federal judge rules that James Joyce's book, *Ulysses*, is not obscene.
- **1957** #1 Hit: Sam Cooke - *You Send Me*
- **1969** 300,000 attend Altamont free concert in California, featuring *The Rolling Stones*. It was marred by violence and four deaths.

Agnes Moorehead

Actress

BORN December 6th, 1900

DIED 1974 (aged 73)

NATIONALITY American

Agnes Moorehead had a six-decade career that included work in radio, stage, film, and television. She is best known for her role as Endora on the television series *Bewitched* (1964 - 1972), but she also has notable roles in films including *Citizen Kane* (1941), *The Magnificent Ambersons* (1942), *Show Boat* (1951), *All That Heaven Allows* (1955), and *Hush... Hush, Sweet Charlotte* (1964).

Moorehead rarely played lead roles, but her range and skill at character development and earned her one Primetime Emmy Award and two Golden Globe awards in addition to nominations for four Academy Awards and six Emmy Awards. Her transition to television won her acclaim for drama and comedy. She could play many different types, but often portrayed haughty, arrogant characters.

She was married twice and had one son.

Eli Wallach

Actor

BORN December 7th, 1915

DIED 2014 (aged 98)

NATIONALITY American

Eli Wallach's career spanned more than six decades, beginning in the late 1940s. He was trained in stage acting, which is what he enjoyed doing most. He became known as "one of the greatest character actors ever to appear on screen", with over 90 film credits.

On stage, he often co-starred with his wife, Anne Jackson, becoming one of the best-known acting couples in the American theater.

For his debut screen performance in *Baby Doll* (1956), he won a BAFTA Award for Best Newcomer and a Golden Globe Award nomination. Among his other most famous films include *The Magnificent Seven* (1960), *The Misfits* (1961), *The Good, the Bad and the Ugly* (1966), *How the West Was Won* (1962), and *The Godfather Part III*.

He was married until his death and had 3 children.
